# **REGULATIONS**

(Reviewed 2018)

1. ***No stock is to be unloaded until ALL RELEVANT paperwork has been submitted to the Chief Steward. See individual sections for specific requirements***
2. ***All stock and animals to remain under the control of the handler at all times***
3. ***NASS will endeavour to take care with all exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss, damage or death.***
4. The competing exhibits must be delivered to the Showground on or before the hour advertised, and shall be classed and distinguished by tickets or numbers affixed to each lot immediately after they are placed in the Show yard.
5. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor or his Principal and shall, during the Show, be under the control of the Stewards, who shall have power to expel from the Showground any person in their opinion interfering unnecessarily therewith.
6. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of exhibitors at the time of entry.
7. The Committee reserves to themselves the right to disqualify any exhibit improperly entered, or regarding which any false statement has been made.
8. All exhibitors must place their exhibits in the place allotted to them by the committee of management or stewards when ordered by the stewards.
9. No tents, booths or hawkers will be allowed on the ground without permission of the Committee.
10. Prize award cards must be affixed to all winning exhibits.
11. Proved wilful misrepresentation of exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize, but render exhibitors liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at future Shows of the Society. The onus of proof to the bona-fides of exhibits will rest upon the exhibitor.
12. No exhibitor or manager of an exhibiting firm (except in the case of an owner riding, driving or leading his exhibit) will be allowed in that section of the yard in which his exhibit is placed during the adjudication by the judges and it shall be the duty of the stewards to prevent any person interfering with the judges, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective lots, or address the judges, unless authorised by the stewards of the section in which there are competing.

## **STEWARDS**

- Must not comment on exhibits in any way that might tend to influence the judge.
- Must only answer questions asked by the Judge, and then only briefly.

The Chief Steward of each section shall arrange for the constant and effective supervision of their section. This includes the recording of given places by the judge/s, affixing of prize cards and ribbons and return of books to the Secretary's Office

## **JUDGES**

Condition of Schedule must be strictly adhered to.

Judges will attend the Showground at the hour appointed and report themselves to the Chief Stewards.

Judges will receive entry books from the Chief Steward of the section, and when they arrive at their decision will at once write the number of the exhibit, with any remarks they desire to make therein.

The decision of the judge/s is final.

Judges will not award prizes to exhibits not considered worthy.

## **ASSOCIATE JUDGES**

Associate Judges must be 18 years of age or over.

## **PRIVILEGES TO MEMBERS**

Free admission to ground and grandstand of all exhibitions of the NASS.

The right to vote at an annual or any general meeting.

Free admission of vehicle to be parked within designate car park area, except for Reserved Car Spaces.

Each member on payment of subscription will be supplied with one member's and one guest ticket (not transferable), for admission to ground and grandstand.

**GATE REGULATION** - All exhibitors, participants and general public must pay on Second Day of Show.

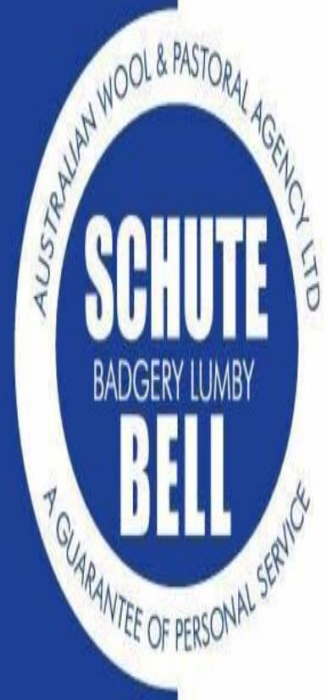

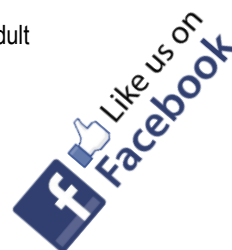

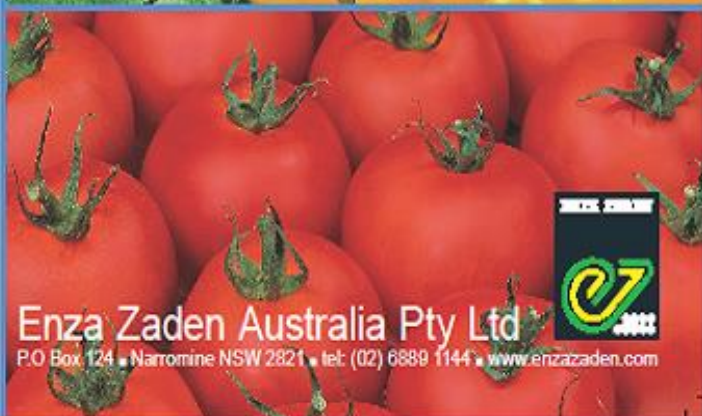

250g	Sultanas
250g	Chopped raisins
250g	Currants
125g	Chopped mixed peel
90g	Chopped red glace cherries
90g	Chopped blanched almonds
250g	Plain flour
60g	Self-raising flour
1/4 tsp	Grated nutmeg
1/2 tsp	Ground ginger
1/2 tsp	Ground cloves
250g	Butter
250g	Soft brown sugar
1/2 tsp	Lemon essence <b>OR</b> finely grated lemon rind
1/2 tsp	Vanilla essence
1/2 tsp	Almond essence
4	Large eggs
1/3 cup	Sherry or brandy

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin. Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

**INSTRUCTIONS TO ALL RING COMPETITORS**

Any competitor arriving at the entrance to the ring after the steward has closed the gate is not eligible to compete in that event.

Indemnity waiver forms must be signed before a rider is able to enter the ring. The only exception is on production of a current membership card to EA, SHC or NSW Driving Association.

No Competitor shall enter the ring other than the class in which he or she competes. Any infringement of this rule shall be dealt with by the horse committee.

**ALL ENTRANTS RIDE OR DRIVE AT THEIR OWN RISK**

The committee reserves the right to call on any competitor subject to age limit at any time, to furnish, at his or her expense birth certificate or other proof of age, and may at its discretion withhold any prize until such certificate or proof shall have been furnished. The age of the competitor shall be taken as on the day of the appearance at the show.

**IMPROPER BEHAVIOUR**

Narromine Agricultural (Show) Society Inc has a zero tolerance to animal cruelty as well as bullying and/or intimidation towards competitors. Neither will not be tolerated. Any deemed actions will lead to the immediate expulsion of the offending competitor, by the Chief Ring Steward, without refund of entries.

Outside assistance to competitors by word, by radio or any other method in horse ring events will NOT be permitted. If in breach of this ruling, competitors and their exhibits may be dismissed from the event and from the showground. Competitor names to be submitted to the ASC.

**DRUGS:** It is forbidden to administer any stimulant, depressant or any drug that is restricted that will show up on any drug test whatsoever, whether before the start of the competition or the previous day. Under maximum penalty disqualification for life of the owner, rider, horse and groom. The Society will drug test any suspicious exhibit to determine whether any drug or stimulant has been administered.

Suitable Attire: Riders in all classes must be suitably attired. A rider or contestants not suitably attired may be precluded by the stewards from competing in an event. No spurs with spikes will be permitted. All competitors in jumping or sporting events must wear an Australian approved skull cap. All competitors competing in any other events under the age of 17 must also wear an Australian approved skull cap.

Measuring: Hacks, Galloways or ponies entered in classes where height is a stipulation, must carry an official height certificate. Should anyone require a measure, someone will be on standby on the day of the show for measuring between 8:00am and 9:30am. Supreme Champion Hack of the Show will be judged after completion of the Hack Classes.

Disputes: Any disputes to be submitted in writing to the Chief Steward within 30 minutes of the end of class/event. This is to be accompanied by a \$50.00 non-refundable fee.
