# REGULATIONS

(Reviewed 2018)

1. ***No stock is to be unloaded until ALL RELEVANT paperwork has been submitted to the Chief Steward. See individual sections for specific requirements***
2. ***All stock and animals to remain under the control of the handler at all times***
3. ***NASS will endeavour to take care with all exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss, damage or death.***
4. The competing exhibits must be delivered to the Showground on or before the hour advertised, and shall be classed and distinguished by tickets or numbers affixed to each lot immediately after they are placed in the Show yard.
5. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor or his Principal and shall, during the Show, be under the control of the Stewards, who shall have power to expel from the Showground any person in their opinion interfering unnecessarily therewith.
6. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of exhibitors at the time of entry.
7. The Committee reserves to themselves the right to disqualify any exhibit improperly entered, or regarding which any false statement has been made.
8. All exhibitors must place their exhibits in the place allotted to them by the committee of management or stewards when ordered by the stewards.
9. No tents, booths or hawkers will be allowed on the ground without permission of the Committee.
10. Prize award cards must be affixed to all winning exhibits.
11. Proved wilful misrepresentation of exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize, but render exhibitors liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at future Shows of the Society. The onus of proof to the bona-fides of exhibits will rest upon the exhibitor.
12. No exhibitor or manager of an exhibiting firm (except in the case of an owner riding, driving or leading his exhibit) will be allowed in that section of the yard in which his exhibit is placed during the adjudication by the judges and it shall be the duty of the stewards to prevent any person interfering with the judges, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective lots, or address the judges, unless authorised by the stewards of the section in which there are competing.

## STEWARDS

- Must not comment on exhibits in any way that might tend to influence the judge.
  - Must only answer questions asked by the Judge, and then only briefly.
- The Chief Steward of each section shall arrange for the constant and effective supervision of their section. This includes the recording of given places by the judge/s, affixing of prize cards and ribbons and return of books to the Secretary's Office

## JUDGES

Condition of Schedule must be strictly adhered to.

Judges will attend the Showground at the hour appointed and report themselves to the Chief Stewards.

Judges will receive entry books from the Chief Steward of the section, and when they arrive at their decision will at once write the number of the exhibit, with any remarks they desire to make therein.

The decision of the judge/s is final.

Judges will not award prizes to exhibits not considered worthy.

## ASSOCIATE JUDGES

Associate Judges must be 18 years of age or over.

## PRIVILEGES TO MEMBERS

Free admission to ground and grandstand of all exhibitions of the NASS.

The right to vote at an annual or any general meeting.

Free admission of vehicle to be parked within designate car park area, except for Reserved Car Spaces.

Each member on payment of subscription will be supplied with one member's and one guest ticket (not transferable), for admission to ground and grandstand.

**GATE REGULATION** - All exhibitors, participants and general public must pay on Second Day of Show.

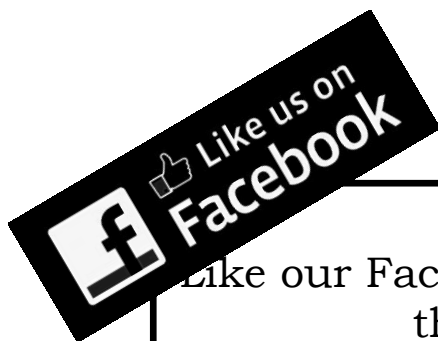

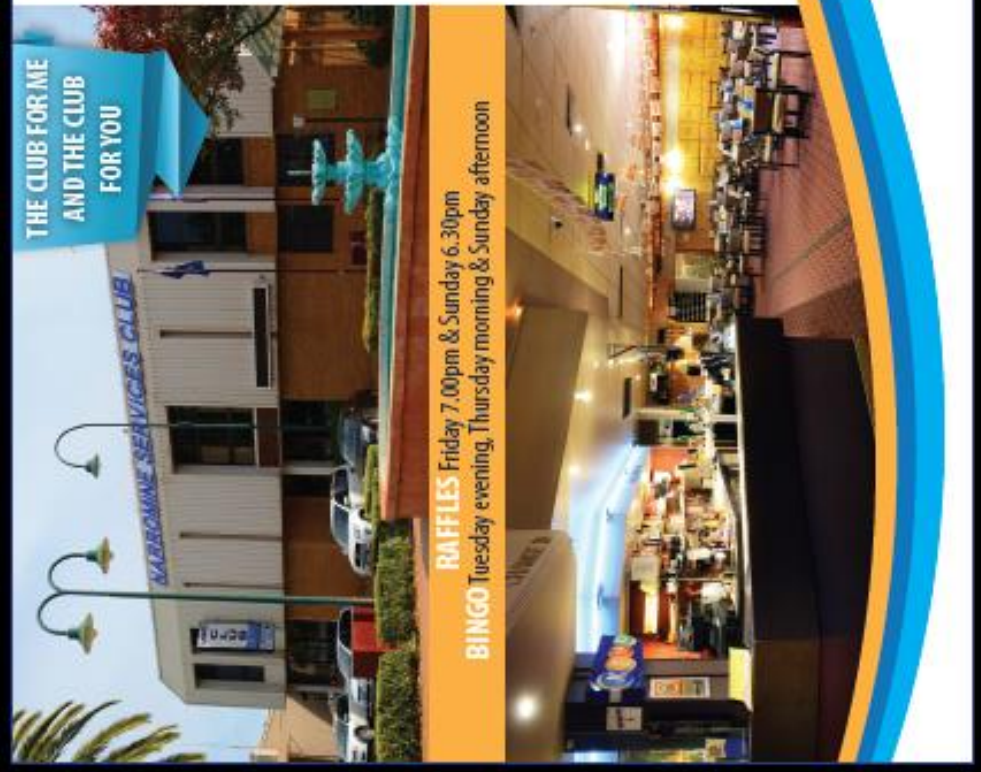
The Narromine Showgirl Competition is open to community minded local woman aged between 18-25 years.

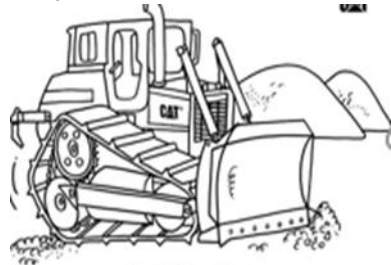



1 1/3 cups coarsely grated carrots

2 cups plain flour

1 teaspoon carb soda

1 teaspoon allspice

1/3 cup milk

1 egg, lightly beaten

Grease a loaf tin and line base. Combine butter, sugar and honey in saucepan and melt over low heat until sugar is dissolved. Stir in apricots and carrots, stir well and cool for five minutes. Sift flour, soda and spice into a bowl and stir in remaining ingredients until just mixed. Pour into loaf tin. Cook in moderate oven, 160C for about 1 1/4 hours or until cooked when tested. Cover with foil if over-browning. Stand 5 minutes then turn out.

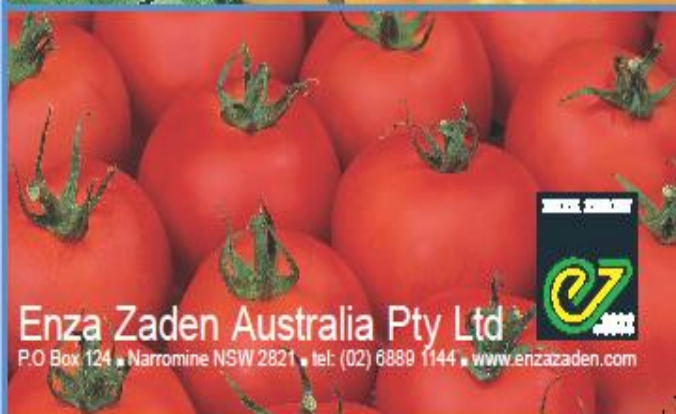

**Rich Fruit Cake - Compulsory Recipe for All Entrants**

250g	Sultanas
250g	Chopped raisins
250g	Currants
125g	Chopped mixed peel
90g	Chopped red glace cherries
90g	Chopped blanched almonds
250g	Plain flour
60g	Self-raising flour
1/4 tsp	Grated nutmeg
1/2 tsp	Ground ginger
1/2 tsp	Ground cloves
250g	Butter
250g	Soft brown sugar
1/2 tsp	Lemon essence <b>OR</b> finely grated lemon rind
1/2 tsp	Vanilla essence
1/2 tsp	Almond essence
4	Large eggs
1/3 cup	Sherry or brandy

Mix together all the fruits and nuts. Sprinkle sherry or brandy over fruit and nuts, cover and leave 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together flour and spices. Cream together butter and sugar with essences.

Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. Mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ to 4 hours.

Allow to cool in the tin.

**Note:** To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces

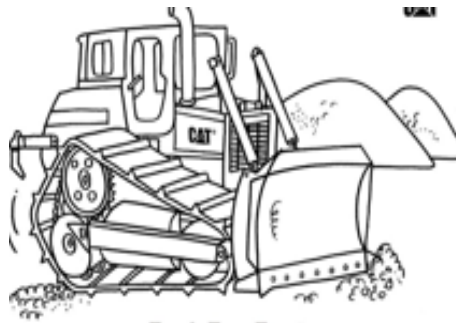
